The Mass Save® Community First Partnership is a collaboration between the City of Boston, Eversource and National Grid. We're working together to provide cost-saving energy efficiency upgrades for you.

During your assessment, an energy specialist will evaluate your energy use and identify ways to save. Through the Mass Save energy efficiency programs, you may be able to receive:

- No-cost air sealing improvements
- \bullet 75%-100% off approved insulation upgrades insulation can help <u>keep heat in</u> during the winter
- Up to \$16,000 in heat pump rebates heat pumps can efficiently <u>heat and cool</u> your home
- 0% financing (up to \$50,000) for energy efficiency upgrades, including heat pumps
- No-cost energy-saving products like programmable thermostats, water-saving devices, advanced power strips, etc.
- No-cost options if you or your tenants qualify as low-income
